What makes Broken Bow great

Cradled between the Red River Basin and the Ouachita Mountains, Broken Bow is located in the southeast corner of Oklahoma on land previously occupied by the Choctaw Native Americans. The value of this territory was highly prized by the Choctaw due to its rich water resources and abundant wildlife that exist to this day. Centered between the major cities of Oklahoma City, Little Rock, D/FW and Shreveport, Broken Bow is also within easy access to the Talimena National Scenic Byway, a 54-mile ride that stretches between Tahleah, Oklahoma, and Mena, Arkansas. This majestic road slices through the Ouachita National Forest and is the most famous mountain expanse between the Appalachians and the Rockies.

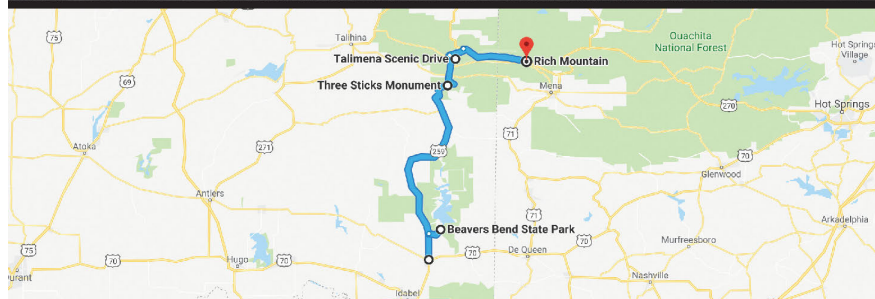

Local rides

Beginning in Broken Bow, take US-259 north. Just a short distance from town you can take a right on US-259A and visit Beavers Bend State Park that sits on the shores of Broken Bow Reservoir. Back on 259 north, you will ride into the foothills of the Kiamichi Mountains that sit at the southern edge of the Ouachita range. Along the way be sure to stop at Three Sticks Monument and enjoy the view. Just before hitting US-59/270, take the OK-1 exit and ride the Talimena Scenic Drive into Arkansas. It has some great overlook areas to pull into as you ride the mountain ridges above the clouds along Rich Mountain and Winding Stair Mountain.
