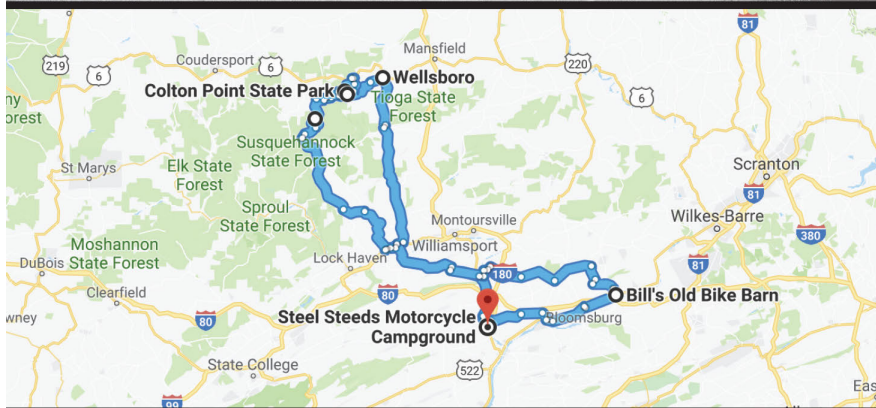

Local rides

From base camp Steel Steeds Motorcycle Campground, ride north about 80 miles on your choice of roads (US-15 or PA-287 are two good ones) to the cool little town of Wellsboro, the gateway to the Pennsylvania Grand Canyon. Two good vantage points for spectacular views of Pine Creek Gorge are Leonard Harrison State Park and Colton State Park on opposite sides of the canyon. Head south on PA-44 south to get to Bill's Old Bike Barn, a museum full of fascinating motorcycle and memorabilia exhibits, and then it's just a 35-mile ride back to Steel Steeds.
